
The events team are hoping to put on some pop up events in January which would be advertised on the COM chat, so if you want something to do here is your invitation.



CA Cornette - Nick

As we all know there was no Corvette available in 1983. The release of the fourth Generation Corvette was 1984. The Corvette C4 is an iconic sports car from Chevrolet. The car was designed by Dave McLellan, who had replaced Zora Arkus-Duntov as Chevrolet's chief designer in 1975.

The C4 marked an important new stage in the evolution of the Corvette; it had a different chassis than the C3, and its body panels and bumpers were made of moulded plastics instead of fiberglass. It also had a more streamlined style and it reintroduced the convertible after an 11-year hiatus.

The Corvette C4 was a major step toward the look, feel and drive of modern cars.

Production ran for 12 years (1984-1996). In 1984 sales were a satisfactory 51,547 in 1984, but sales slowly dropped off over the years. The revised body, interior, and introduction of the more powerful LT1 motor in 1991 did little to improve sales. Through the series GM kept making regular improvements. The later models were a very different car than the earlier C4's that were prone to squeaks rattles and harsh suspension, despite all the improvements and updates the last 5 years of production saw sales figure lingering between 23646 and 20479 p.a. GM wanted to pull the pin on the Corvette and relegate it to history. Save for a few engineers who thought different and were passionate about the Corvette. They worked behind senior managements backs and secretly worked away at the next Generation Corvette the C5. The rest is history. A must read book for all corvette enthusiasts is, All Corvettes are Red, by James Schefter. In Australia many Corvettes were imported between the years of 1984 and 1994 and converted to RHD by professionals for example Corvette Clinic was well know for converting C4's, and some not to professional companies and back yarders. Buying a RHD Corvette can be a bit of a challenge if you do not know what you're looking for. A bad conversion and you have bad car and possibly a lemon, worst still a dangerous one.

The introduction of the RAWS, Registered Auto Workshop Scheme requiring importers to apply for a license to bring in vehicles built after the 1st of January 1989. The import of such vehicles required them to be converted to RHD and engineered to make them comply with ADR's Australian Design Rules. Rules varied for each vehicle based on the year it was manufactured. To my knowledge no one applied for RAWS approval for C4s because the C5 Corvette was available and it made sense to import later models like the C5 corvette and later C6's.

The Federal Government In September revised the rules. With the introduction the SEV's Specialist and Enthusiast Vehicles allowing the importation of Enthusiast Vehicles into Australia providing the car is 25 year old or older. For Corvette enthusiasts' the last 12 months have seen many 1990 to 1996 Corvettes coming to our shores.

Each State and Territory has their own rules, and requirements for Registration and acceptance on the Club Permit Scheme (CPS) varies from State to State.

For Victoria only. The requirements for normal registration is the vehicle needs to be 30 year old, and needs to comply with the same rules as for the Club Permit scheme with the exception that you do not need to belong to a car club.

For the Club permit Scheme (CPS) the vehicle needs to be 25 years old or older. Owners need to Join a Car Club which is a registered Car Club with Vic Roads.

Additionally, the owner needs to obtain a VASS certificate (Vehicle Assessment Signatory Scheme) which is the framework governed by VicRoads to ensure that modified, imported and individually constructed vehicles meet engineering and safety standards for registration.

If we take for example a C4 Corvette manufactured after the 1st of January 1989 you will need the following:

- Rewiring of your taillight with rear amber lights for the turn signals. Depending on year some modifications maybe needed to the front indicators as well.
- The replacement of your headlights are required. These are inexpensive and can be locally sourced, they are better quality than the originals **GM** installed. Note whilst you are changing your headlights, if they are making a clacking sound when going up or down than now is the time to pull them out and re-

place the clutch pellets. Normally the nylon gears are okay. Word of advice do not buy the brass gear as they are expensive, and a waste of money. More often than not it's the three clutch pellets that turn to dust and cause the issue. These can easily be made on a 3D printer or turned out of a little bit of nylon rod, Save §125 for two sets.

- Seat Belts must be replaced as the US belts do not comply. Seat belts are easy to source locally, you can order them in the same colour as per the originals. Seat belts change through the years and you must specify what year your car was built when ordering otherwise you may end up with the wrong ones. Also the seat belt stalks may need to be replaced as well, usually 1995 to 1996 models. If ordering stalks they need the built in switch to turn of the seat belt light. Driver side only.
- Side indicator lights are a requirement and these must be installed to comply with ADR's.
- Other requirement is that the parking lights need to be positioned no less than 300 mm from the extreme edge of the vehicle. The rear side markers need to have the bulb removed and the lens blacked out. Do not ask me why.
- Other requirement are that the instrumentation lights and the driver information panel lights need to work as per manufacturers specifications, ie, hand brake light, brake warning light, airbag, abs lights, etc.

The attached photos will give you an idea of the work required for the Vass.

Costs, nothing is cheap these days but a safe rule is allow about \$2,000-\$2500 for engineering and compliance.

Other requirements is a RWC. We all had experience getting those except these days the cost about \$250. Word of warning. Do not get A VASS Certificate if car need a lot of work for a RWC. Engineer does not check brakes (except Brake hoses). Does not check for oil leaks, tires, and other RW items. If your car is going to be in a workshop for any period of time be ware your VASS Certificate Expires in 28 Days.

Hope that helps anyone wishing to buying a 25 year old Corvette

To build your C8 with this technique you won't need any mechanical ability or even any tools. But then again, you won't be able to drive it either. GM offers two methods on their Chevy website to build yourself a virtual C8 Corvette so you can price it and see what it looks like.



The first method involves the "Configurator". This build tool concentrates on the full specification of the vehicle being built and the end result provides multiple images of the car, inside and out, as well as the Maximum Suggested Retail Price (MSRP). You work your way through the vehicle specifications while you watch both the price and the images of the vehicle update. You initially specify a coupe or convertible, then select the trim level, the colour, the option packages and so-on.




If you are looking seriously at an Australian buy, it is best to start with the base level Australian spec, which includes a non-premium colour, 2LT Trim Level, Z51 Performance Package, Magnetic Ride Adjustment and Front Lift with memory. In the "Packages" section, load the Z51 Performance Package. Then, in the "Exterior" section add the "Z51 performance suspension with Magnetic Selective Ride Control". Right above that, check the box for "Front lift with memory". All the boxes associated with the 2LT trim level and the Z51 package will already be checked and will mention the option is included in the package. Pon't change anything else at this stage, and you should end up with the "Summary" showing a price of \$79,995. This is of course the US price of the car. In Australia, the equivalent price is AU\$144.990. which is GMSV's RRP. On-road costs need to be added to this.



You can now go through all the specifications and add whatever you want. But you can't go back and delete any of the options listed above which comprise the Australian minimum specification. The first tip I must provide you is if you stray from the Mulan Leather to the Napa Leather, the trim level will update to 3LT, with a corresponding large increase in price. Keep an eye on this if you change any interior options.



As an example of a build, I've stuck with Arctic White exterior, but have added the "Full Length Pual Racing Stripe package, Edge Red", and have updated the interior to "Adrenaline Red, Mulan Leather". I've also gone for the "Carbon Flash-painted aluminium wheels with machined edge". As the engine is on display from outside the car, I've chosen to add the "6.2L engine cover in Edge Red" to improve the look.




As much as I wanted to stop spending, I couldn't help but add the "Bright Red-painted brake calipers" and then in the Interior section, the "Torch Red seat belt colour". Then, it's time to take a look at the images of the car. Note there are 6 different exterior views and 4 interior views. You also have the choice of viewing the car with the roof either Up or Pown. I was happy with the look but noted the vehicle price had risen to US?83,500.

This means I added a total of US \$3,505 in options to the base Australian spec. I won't go into the justification of the math, but if you were able to specify this car in Australia, those options SHOULD cost about double the US price. This would make the options worth some

AU $\stackrel{.}{\circ}$ 7,010, bringing the total Australian price to about AU $\stackrel{.}{\circ}$ 152,000. Then finally, you can add costs of about AU $\stackrel{.}{\circ}$ 15,000 to get it on the road here in Victoria.

The second way to build your own C8 is with the "Visualiser". In fact, there are two Visualisers: One for the 2022 Stingray model, the other for the 2023 Z06 model. We'll stick with the



2022 Stingray and build something different to the white coupe above.

This time we simply go into the different sections and specify what we want. There are some interactive tips on the website on how to use it, so it shouldn't be too difficult. Start by picking the Body Style. I've gone for the convertible this time. Forget the Special Editions as we can't get them here, although there's nothing to stop you building one of these if you want. Work your way through the different sections: Exterior Colours, Performance Wheels, etc. This is much quicker than the Configurator as we are only choosing visual items. I've chosen



Hypersonic Grey paint, Carbon Flash Open Spoke Wheels, Red Calipers, Black Ground Effects (which also gives me the high wing spoiler), 2LT Trim, Adrenaline Red Interior and Red Seat Belts.

I can now view both the Exterior and Interior and I'm able to rotate and tilt the car to look at it from all angles, both exterior and interior. I can also turn the Studio Lights ON/OFF for a more dramatic look. This time there is no pricing. Click on "Next Steps" and you can download your chosen view of the vehicle or share it with friends.

The Visualiser becomes quite addictive, letting you try all sorts of combinations. It's worth trying the Z06 Visualiser as well, since it offers you a range of extra options available with the model year 2023 Z06.

It's all up to you now. Build your C8

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
