

#### AUSTRALIAN CORVETTE LEGEND PETER WHISTON PASSES AWAY AT 71

Whilst I have known Peter Whiston for just 28 years, many Corvette enthusiasts around the world have known Peter a great deal longer.

Peter had been an early instigator (40 + years) in converting Corvettes to Right Hand Prive. His successful conversion shop "Corvette Clinic" in Melbourne was established in 1980.

Many hundreds of Corvettes (C3-C7) were professionally converted to RHD at "The Clinic". Not only for the Australian market, but for overseas clients as well.

I recall one of my earlier visits to the Corvette Museum in Bowling Green KY, (Dec 97) the front desk guy quoted "The only place in the world to get a RHD Corvette is from Corvette Clinic in Australia".



So yes, Peter's Corvette Clinic was an international leader in Corvette RHD conversions.

Ultimately when I brought my new '98 C5 into Australia there was no hesitation on where I would have my Vette converted to RHD.

From that time Peter & I became good friends along with Peter's wife Gayle.

In more recent years my wife, Dianne & I were fortunate to "Travel all about Australia" alongside the Whiston's. The really hard part was the wining & dining, the card playing & the loads of laughter.

PROFILE Peter Whiston Life Member - Corvettes of Melbourne

It was with great pleasure that the club bestowed Life Membership on Peter Whiston at our April meeting.

So who is Peter Whiston? Most of those who have been around the club for a number of years know a good deal about him. The rest of us know him through Corvette Clinic, his attendance at meetings, his readiness to open his garage (man cave) and bbq for club occasions, such as the release of the C7 in February, and for his easy going manner.

But we demand to know more for the record. So while we had a few quiet moments at the Convention in South Australia I was able to catch up with Peter to pose a few questions so that our members could know a bit more about our newest and deserving life member.

Peter says he has been a car nut from his youngest years collecting and assembling model cars, racing slot cars and taking notice of the different cars cruising the streets of inner Melbourne.

One that caught his interest when he was about 14 was a silver C2, which was extremely rare in Australia as Corvettes even then had to be converted for Australian roads. Needless to say Peter was besotted, particularly by it's interior, and a life long passion for things Corvette started.

As a motor mechanic working mainly on trucks for Preston Motors, Peter honed his skills and in 1977 he purchased his first Corvette. A 1970 L46, it wasn't pristine by any stretch of the imagination, but broken and bastardised with a 1976 clip on nose. After over 1500 hours work, he completed his first conversion and in 1979 it was back on the road.

At the first National Corvette Convention in 1980, Peter won the motorkana and having impressed one particular punter, sold the car to him then and there. With the proceeds he took his first trip to the USA where he purchased a 1976 C3, which he also converted and sold. Over the next couple of years he imported or purchased locally a number of Corvettes. These he converted as a sideline while holding down his regular job. This included converting cars for others wanting to enjoy the right hand drive experience.

This of course eventually led to parting company with his employer at the time and starting up Corvette Clinic. Since that time Peter estimates he has had a direct hand in converting well over 400 Corvettes. That number does not include cars that came through his workshop that he did not directly work on. C3's originally cost \$2,500 to convert and this now extends to about \$50,000 for recent C6's. Most number of cars converted are C4's, which he has lost count of.

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His car club activities have extended to joining the Corvette Car Club of Australia in 1977, maintaining membership until it disbanded in the mid 1980's. Out of the ashes of the CCCA Peter, Scott Morden, Tim Guillieri, Martin Hasslinghouse and soon after Webby, started Corvettes of Melbourne. This was in 1990. Peter has been President a number of times but he says that when Webby came along and assumed the Presidency, he was a hard man to remove.

Not only has the Corvette Clinic been a strong supporter of the club it has also been a great financial supporter of the club when it has been our turn to host National Conventions. And of course Peter has been a source of knowledge and information for Corvette owners keen to keep faith with their love of Corvettes.

A realist, Peter understood the need to retire from working life and transfer the business over to Kane who now has total responsibility for things. Peter enjoys access rights to the workshop and the opportunity to proffer advice if asked, but he is proud to see Kane as the new proprietor of Corvette Clinic.

He says that the new C7 conversion plan is about 75% completed. Things like the dash cannot just be flipped over, and will require nearly twice as many man hours when compared with a C6. Other issues concern the electric steering which is some 8 times more expensive than converting a mechanical system.

Peter and Gayle own 9 Corvettes between them, of which none is a particular favourite. One problem when you have this many cars is storage and most of us have now had the pleasure of checking out what has to be one of the best "man caves" around. The mezzanine, which Peter says was an after thought, gives his cave an added dimension of which we are truly envious.

Peter says he and Gayle have no big plans for the future apart from maybe the acquisition of a houseboat for the enjoyment of the next generation of Whistons. Gayle has as always been integral to most things Peter has been involved in. In the early days she let him go off to conventions with the other guys. Since that time Gayle is seen at most functions, meetings and events with Peter, sharing their company with other members of the club. Their latest toy, the mid 50's Chev tray truck, now converted to flat top tow truck, was Gayle's recommendation as a way of transporting cars around. Peter mentioned that as he is now retired he is only to happy to offer advice if any one has an issue with their car.

While Peter was surprised to be given life membership he was very proud of the moment and glad to see his family and friends there to help him enjoy it.

Peter, we thank you for your contribution to the club.

After a bit of research I contacted Corvette Clinic and spoke to a Peter Whiston who promptly recruited me into Corvettes of Melbourne. The rest is history.


Over the years to come, I got to know Peter well. We served on the club's committee together for many years and worked on many events including track days and conventions.
