### Sunday 26 March 2023



There is a 200 seat bistro for dinner on the Sat night.





This is what good Corvette people do for each other. – Thankyou both!!!!



Those of you who have participated in the Australian Corvette Nationals will be well aware there is a featured Show 'n' Shine event where entered cars are judged according to the generation of the car, as well as being divided into three different categories – Original, Personalised or Modified. As with any competition that involves subjective scoring by a group of judges, there are always a number of unhappy competitors who disagree with the scoring. But the judging of the merits of the individual cars is not as contentious as is the category into which many of the cars are fitted.

For instance – a car in the "Original" class can have up to three modifications. But there is no definition of what those modifications can be. So, if I fit a supercharger that pokes out through the hood, a high rear wing and racing wheels and slicks, I can see no current reason the car couldn't enter the Original class.

As for the "Personalised" class, this class allows up to 8 modifications! I'm thinking Chrysler hemi engine with Lenco transmission, four-link rear suspension with Ford 9" diff, racing seats, full roll-cage, and I still haven't used up my full eight modifications! I know what I have just suggested is ridiculous, but where do you draw the line? If not a supercharger, how about a turbo or a tunnel ram manifold? What modifications are okay?

In my mind there should be a points system, assigning penalty points for each individual modification. As an example, if a maximum of 50 penalty points puts you out of the Original class,





a supercharger should attract a penalty of over 50 points, putting the car out of Original even if there were no more modifications. Perhaps a set of non-factory floor mats may be penalised 10 points, or a pair of Edelbrock valve covers 25 points. This points system would take a little effort to develop, but to me it's something that must be done. Many of the cars being judged these days are worth well over \$100,000 and deserve better consideration than being judged in a competition whose rules are nebulous at best.

So, what should the rules be, and why is it important? Let's start with the "why". I believe it is really important to preserve and promote a group of cars that display our Corvettes just as they were originally built. We can encourage owners to aspire to returning to or retaining their Corvettes in their as-built configuration. We do have cars in Australia that fit into the NCRS category, and this is really great to see. However here in Australia it's impossible to find old Corvettes in factory original condition in the way we may find old Holdens and Fords hidden in a remote barn. To own an NCRS car you pretty much need to buy one in the US and import it. But what we can do here is restore our Corvettes to what I call "Visually Correct" condition. While NCRS cars value originality over restoration, our Visually Correct cars can be judged on the quality of their restoration, with new paintwork, restored used parts and brand-new reproduction parts. These two classes each have their merits and can stand alongside one another. With the low number of NCRS classified cars in Australia, I believe they should have their own special display rather than being judged.



## Correctiles on Show-Part 1



So, what would the rules be for the Original or Visually Correct (VC) class? I'll specifically talk about C3 Corvettes as this was the longest running generation and the predominant generation Corvette here in Australia. The same rules can apply quite well to other Corvette generations. To be in the Original/VC class, the cars would need to fit within the following rules. If they had too many incorrect features, they could either be moved to the Personalised class or they could remain in the VC class but would be docked numerous points for their incorrect features.

### EXTERIOR:

The car should have all the correct body parts for its model year. So, no substitution of engine hoods from different model years or engine types, no substitution of front or rear fascias from another model year, no aftermarket hood scoops, front or rear spoilers, side skirts, or flared guards. The correct badges and decals must be used. Neither should the car be excessively lowered. Most importantly, the car must be painted in a colour that was available for that model year.

Rear exhaust tips must be correct for the model year, and factory side pipes can be fitted only to 1969 cars. Wheels must be correct for the model year, meaning the factory C3 alloy wheels can only be fitted to 1976 and later cars. All earlier cars must be fitted with rally wheels, equipped with the wheel covers that were available for that model year. Tyres should be of a similar size to those originally fitted – no big oversize tyres. I suggest a list of acceptable tyre sizes should be released.

### **INTERIOR:**

Interior colour must be one that was available for that model year. Seat design should be correct for that model year with the correct trim pattern. If the Deluxe Interior was available for that particular year, it may be fitted, but it should be complete. ie. wood trim, leather seats, carpet door trim, and special cut-pile carpeting should all be fitted, not just selected parts.



The correct steering wheel should be fitted, as well as the correct radio. In other words, no conversion of the gauge panel to fit a single DIN radio.

### **ENGINE BAY:**

The engine must be painted the correct colour, must use the correct air cleaner and rocker covers (not aftermarket), which can only be chrome or alloy if available factory fitted. The car should run the correct cooling fan and shroud, as well as the correct recovery tank and normal black rubber hoses. The fuel pump should be the original style mechanical pump but should not be an oversize or chromed aftermarket pump.

The correct Delco style distributor (or replica) must be fitted with all the radio shields and correct style plug leads. The engine should have the factory fitted intake manifold, and the exhaust manifolds should be the original style cast iron (not extractors/headers).

As the criteria for the VC class is that the car should be visually correct, there are some hidden components that I would exempt from being the original designs. In later years, after this class is further developed, some of these exemptions could be removed to make the cars even more correct. A good example of an exemption is the use of Holley carburettors. As the carburettor is fairly much hidden by the Corvette's large original air cleaners, it doesn't have a lot of influence on the car's visual appearance. I would grant this exemption due to so many C3 Corvettes being fitted with the relatively simple Holley carbs, replacing the more complicated Rochester Quadrajets. The cost of replacing a Holley with a Quadrajet, plus the potentially difficult operation of tuning it to suit the engine makes it simpler to retain the Holley. As I said, this could be repealed in, say, 5 years' time with plenty of warning to owners of the rule change.

Other exemptions I would allow are suspension components that are relatively hard to see. Composite rear springs, adjustable length rear strut rods, non-original dampers and crossmember reinforcement plates are all items that are relatively invisible, but make the owner's life a little easier. Again, some or all these exemptions could be repealed over time.

### SUMMARY:

I must repeat that I very strongly believe in retaining a class of Corvettes in Australia that are "Visually Correct". It is important to preserve the history of Corvettes in Australia. We need cars that can be shown to the public, the enthusiasts, the aspiring owners, and the current owners to show them exactly how the cars appeared when they were built. To encourage the restoration or maintaining of these original condition cars, we need to have a judging class at the Nationals that marks cars largely on their visual originality.

The suggested rules for the "Original" or Visually Correct" class are just that – suggestions. Nor is my list of rules complete. It is offered as a strong suggestion for having the rules for the Original class encourage originality rather than allowing clearly non-original cars to compete and too often win the class. I firmly believe we need to promote visually correct cars among Corvette Club members and installing this as the requirement for the existing class currently known as "Original". This would be a major step in encouraging many owners to restore their cars as visually correct. This would be a major plus for Australia's Corvette community.

I am interested in hearing your feedback, don't hesitate to get in touch.

Next time I will give my thoughts on the "Personalised" class rules.

Below you will find a brief summary of each role (more detail available from current or past position holders):

**President:** The President is the leader of the club and is there to ensure the club is run efficiently administratively, financially and socially to support the enjoyment of our vehicles. The club president is responsible for running club meetings and committee meetings, guiding committee members, delegating tasks as necessary. and maintaining regular open communication as the face of the club.

**Vice President:** The role of the Vice President can be summarized in one word - service The Vice President serves the President, other club officers, committees and the general membership. 
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
