

Point Nepean Heritage Motor Show

The second running of the Pt. Nepean Classic Car Show was held on the Sunday of the Melbourne Cup long weekend at the scenic Officers Quarters at the Point Nepean Quarantine Station, within the Pt Nepean National Park at Portsea, about a 90 minute cruise from Melbourne.

The event is coordinated by the Sorrento-Portsea Rotary Club, with funds raised going to support the Southern Peninsula Laundry And Shower Program (SPLaSh).

SPLaSh is a free service offering practical support in a friendly, welcoming environment to community members who are sleeping rough or experiencing other forms of homelessness. The program offers access to showers, washing machines and dryers with soap, shampoo, towels and laundry powder provided. Food is also provided, a simple lunch and something to take away if desired. There are toiletry packs and access to other material aid including tents, swags and bedding. Every night more than 160 people are sleeping rough on the Mornington Peninsula. At 16% of the Shire's homeless population, that is about 3 times the national average of 6%.

With more than 400 classic cars and bikes entered in the event, many making the last minute decision based on the beautiful weather over the weekend I'm sure, the picturesque venue had no problems accommodating us all. In the grounds adjacent to the display areas a 'the village' is established with tables and chairs, a stage accommodating the local community radio station and bands, and a terrific variety of food and drink vans catering for everything from a coffee and toastie, to fine glass of chilled Italian Prosecco.

Our CoM contingent was made of C1, C2,C3, C4 Corvettes a Rambler, Ford Escort Rally Pack, a pretty little Triumph TR4 and a beautiful '60s VW Combi that might be familiar to some. We met early at Blairgowrie, grabbed a coffee, then made our way to the event.

The event itself only runs from 10:00am until 2:00pm, but that provides plenty of time to wander around admiring the many beautifully presented vehicles, and to vote for your choice of category winners based on decade of manufacture and to partake in a refreshment or two. We were all super excited for Stephan Younane who won the 1960-1969 category in his meticulously restored VW Combi Van.

As the show closed, and so as to avoid the traffic making its way back to Melbourne we retreated to the sun-drenched deck of the Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron to enjoy a cold drink and some light refreshments and to debrief on what really was an enjoyable Sunday on the Mornington Peninsula.

No doubt the show will be run again next year, and I would encourage anyone not committed for the long weekend to register and joining the fun.

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



We based ourselves at the Wandiligong Caravan Park.


Friday we headed up to Mt Buffalo to take in the spectacular views and historic Chalet.

Living with Cars - Tony

Living with CARS.

I've self-diagnosed that I now suffer from Corvette Acquisition and Restoration Syndrome (CARS)*

Cars were always in my blood. My grandmother, to my acute embarrassment, used to boast that as a two year old I could correctly name every car and truck that passed by. That was 1956, so I guess most were imports – I couldn't do that now!



My first notable appearance in the family photo album was at 10 months old, in my parents' arms at the Templestowe Hill Climb. It was definitely my dad's influence (mum's a musician). I never had a chance.

I remember hours spent on rainy days with my 3 brothers drawing cars of all sorts, hot rods, race cars, EJ-HR Holdens, VW beetles. Number 3 brother (who went on to a career in art) ran a side hustle when he was about 10 y o, designing 'knock-off' RatFink T-shirts! Ed 'Big Daddy' Roth would have been horrified. We were a class act!



During the sixties I got heavily into assembling AMT 1/24 scale model cars. I was particularly keen on George Barris Kustoms, of which there were many. It was very cool when Barris designed cars started appearing on TV (eg. Get Smart, The Monkees, The Munsters, Batman).

We built up such a large collection of model cars, that my dad built several special display cases for them. Recently, one of my brothers produced one of the display cases which had been in storage for a number of years.

It brought back a flood of memories. Two of my earliest models were these C1 and C2 Vettes. They are a bit tatty now but were always my favourites.



Who would have thought? It might have taken 50 years, but I finally graduated from these models to this, a 40th Anniversary (1993) Ruby Red Collector Edition C4 which I aim to gradually restore to pristine condition (it's not too bad anyway).



Ruby and I joined last month's Stingray Run, our first. It was a fantastic weekend. The runs were great, Ruby is a dream to drive, and I haven't laughed so much on a weekend away for years!

It's a variant of a condition that I and many others suffer, Guitar Acquisition Syndrome (GAS)! I'm told charcoal is a good antidote.


